Baby David, who was diagnosed with hydrocephalus, has undergone a challenging yet hopeful medical journey. Hydrocephalus, a condition characterized by the accumulation of fluid in the brain, required urgent surgical intervention. Through specialized care and successful operations, including the placement of a medical shunt to manage the fluid buildup, David has shown remarkable improvement.

Today, we are overjoyed to report that Baby David is doing much better and has been safely reunited with his twin sister here at DCV. Seeing them together again, surrounded by love and care, is a powerful reminder of what collective support can achieve.



Update on Baby Paul

Baby Paul, who was rescued from a situation of neglect and physical abuse, arrived at DCV in a fragile state, suffering from severe malnourishment. His case remains under the care and supervision of the Children's Officer in Msambweni.

We are pleased to share that Baby Paul has made significant progress. With proper nutrition, medical attention, and emotional support, he is now healthier, more stable, and thriving within the safe environment at DCV. His recovery continues to inspire us all.

We are delighted to share developmental progress among our younger children:

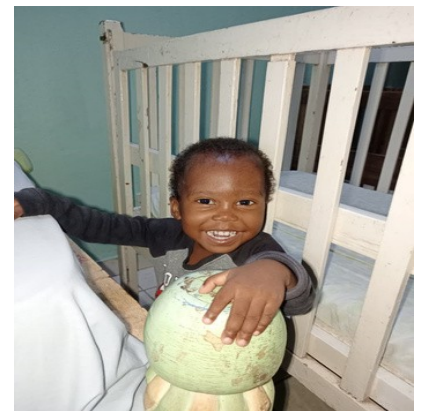
- Baby Hope and Mustafa have both started walking, a milestone achieved through consistent physiotherapy sessions.

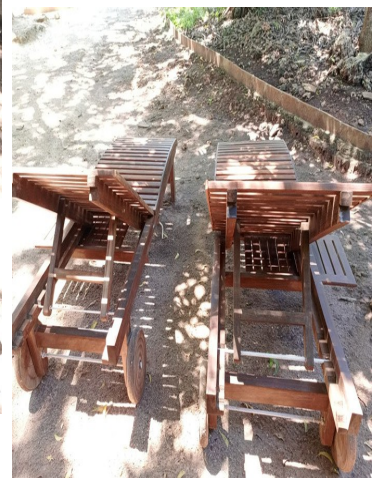


General Welfare Update
